

Not Your Standard Partnership Model

The California GEAR UP model differs from the Partnership model in terms of participants. The GEAR UP Partnership Programs follow a cohort of students starting in middle school as contrasted to the California GEAR UP Program that supports the adults who directly serve the students.

Program Duration

September 2018- September 2024

Schools will become part of the California GEAR UP network and will receive services that ensure that ALL students are ready to enter and succeed in the higher educational setting of their choice.







Systems Transformation Model

The Whole School Model's goal is to develop and sustain the capacity of feeder sets of middle and high schools to prepare all students for higher education through a systemic network of support for adults—teachers as well as counselors, school leaders, and families—who influence secondary school students. This expanded capacity is expected to result in a higher proportion of students, particularly from backgrounds and communities that historically have not pursued a college education, graduating from high school able to access the greatest number of postsecondary choices from the widest array of options without the need for remediation.

Bridge Model

The Bridge Model serves to strengthen the connections among all schools in a local high school feeder pattern and assists with intersegmental transitions. Data will be collected to measure the impact on student achievement and retention and will provide valuable information about the importance of aligning curriculum, increased communication across educational levels, and the ability for California GEAR UP to assist in sustaining a college-going culture.

Systemic Impact Model

The Systemic Impact Model is at the core of the Program's intentionality to create systemic statewide change in that lessons learned, effective practices developed, and resources created are expected to be infused into the state's educational reform movement. The more members of various societal sectors involved and impacted by this model, the greater the chances to transform the educational system such that it is more equitable, effective, and efficient for all students.






